Adding insult to injury

LUIS Suarez is the latest big name to have his World Cup aspirations threatened by injury. The Uruguayan had minor surgery to a damaged meniscus last week, which normally carries a recovery time of four to six weeks. The tournament starts in three.

The reality is that it's highly unlikely Suarez will not be risked for the tournament, such is his importance to the team.

He'll push the limits using every method possible, and will probably play at 80%, regardless of injury.

He'll be in good company too. The volume of football played by the top stars guarantees that the build-up to football's global showpiece event is always punctuated by "will he, won't he?" questions around the health of its biggest names.

David Beckham's broken foot introduced many to hyperbaric oxygen treatment ahead of the 2002 edition, and countryman Wayne Rooney took his place in 2006. There was nothing that oxygen (or anything else) could do for Beckham's achilles tendon in 2010, when he was joined on the sidelines by Michael Ballack.

Suarez is in good company in 2014 too. Cristiano Ronaldo, Victor Valdes, Diego Costa, Radamel Falcao and Karim Benzema are just some of the names who have had the last two months of their European seasons hampered by injury. Many will still play in Brazil, even if not 100% healthy, only because of the importance of the event. The team you could select from players carrying injury doubts into the tournament might be superior to any that will take to the field in pursuit of the Fifa World Cup trophy.

It's the long-term problem — once the lights are out in Brazil and the trophy has been raised — that questions the sustainability of the current model.

So many players are hanging on for one more month before they have necessary surgeries, or at least an extended break.

The World Cup shortens that break by six weeks, a problem further compounded by the global interest in football which has spawned pre-season world tours during which, prompted by enormous money, the stars are obliged to trot out in exhibition matches in Asia, North America or the Emirates.

The result is that club teams with international stars, such as Real Madrid, Manchester City and Barcelona, will start next

season carrying players who are neither healthy nor fully rested but extremely tired.

If this scenario seems familiar, it's because it mirrors the problem faced by rugby. The interminable, never-ending Super rugby season is approaching its international break, before resuming in the build-up to the Rugby Championship. Then follows more rugby, then more, and then a short off-season.

The best players carry their teams through to finals, meaning they play three or four more high-quality matches per year than their peers — and they earn Springbok caps too.

It adds up to a possibility of more than 30 matches a year and it's the reason why, no matter your provincial leaning, you are watching weekend rugby action bemoaning the

loss of key players to injury. Our list, like football's, is made up of stars who play for as long as possible before their willing minds can no longer compensate for their failing bodies.

An obstacle to change is that we have yet to scientifically quantify the upper limits of matches that predict compromised performance and injury. We make statements like "players should not play more than X number of matches a year", but the value of "X" remains a bald assertion, unlike in baseball or the NFL, where stats plus science have solved the equation so that assets (players) can be protected.

Those in charge often have no incentive to solve X, of course, because the geese laying the golden eggs are easily replaced.

But, until it is, expect the carousel to turn ever faster, and more "geese" to pay the price with their careers.

Bolt not needed in relay

YOHAN Blake and a speedy Jamaican 4x200m relay team did not need Usain Bolt to add to the island nation's collection of world records on Saturday.

Blake, the world's second-fastest 200m runner behind Bolt, turned on the jets and anchored Jamaica to a world record 1 min 18.63 seconds at the inaugural IAAF World Relays in the Bahamas.

The sizzling performance took 0.05 seconds off a 20-year-

old record held by a Carl Lewis-anchored US team in 1994.

"We knew we could come here and get this medal and world record," said Blake.

"It feels very good enough. I think that we could have gone faster," added the 100m Olympic silver medallist.

The US team wrapped up the evening of speed by winning the women's 4x100m in 41.88 seconds with rivals Jamaica second. — Reuters
